ORDER

Before the court is Defendant's Motion to Extend Time to Comply with the Court's January 8, 2025 Order (Dkt. 119), which orders Defendant to produce certain documents by February 7, 2025. Dkt. 121. Defendant asks for an extension from February 7, 2025 to March 7, 2025. *Id.* Plaintiffs partially oppose the extension because the dispositive motion deadline is currently set for March 10, 2025. Dkt. 123; *see* Dkt. 94. Plaintiffs prefer either that Defendant receives a two-week extension or that the parties receive a corresponding 30-day extension on the dispositive motion deadline. Dkt. 123. Furthermore, Plaintiffs ask that Defendant produce documents on a rolling basis throughout the extension period. *Id.*

The court, finding good cause shown by Defendant, **GRANTS** Defendant's motion and extends the deadline for compliance with the court's January 8 order to **March 7**, 2025. Defendant is not required to complete the administrative record on a rolling basis. In light of this extension, the undersigned recommends the District Judge look favorably on any subsequent motions to extend the dispositive motion deadline.
